

APPLICATION FOR INCOME TAX EXEMPTION APPROVED: RHULANI MABASA CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION

The South African Revenue Service (SARS) would like to confirm that your application for exemption from income tax has been approved as you meet the requirements of a Public Benefit Organisation (PBO) set out in section 30(3) of the Income Tax Act No 58 of 1962 (the Act) from 4 May 2016. Your Income Tax Exemption has been granted in terms of section 10(1)(cN) of the Act. Annual receipts and accruals will therefore be subject to the provisions of section 10(1)(cN) of the Act and accruals and receipts from trading or business activities which fall outside the parameters of section 10(1)(cN) will be subject to tax.

The following exemptions also apply and are limited to:

1. The public benefit organisation has been approved for purposes of section 18A(1)(a) of the Act and donations to the organisation will be tax deductible in the hands of the donors in terms of and subject to the limitations prescribed in section 18A of the Act with effect from 14 August 2017.
2. Donations made to or by the PBO are exempt from Donations Tax in terms of section 56(1)(h) of the Income Tax Act.
3. Exemption from the payment of Estate Duty in terms of section 4(h) of the Estate Duty Act No.45 of 1955.

In order to maintain your exempt status, the following conditions must be complied with:

1. Amend the founding document stipulating the requirements of section 30 of the Income Tax Act, the following clauses must be added to the constitution -
 - i. The activities of the organisation are carried on in a non-profit manner and with an altruistic or philanthropic intent.

CONSTITUTION OF RHULANI MABASA CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION

The name of the organization will be called RHULANI MABASA CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION. The shortened name will be R.M.C.F

The organization shall:

1. Exist it's own right , separately from it's members
2. Continue to exist even when it's members' changes and there are different office bearer's
3. Be able to sign contracts and enter into relationships
4. Be able to own property and other possessions.
5. To receive funding from donors
6. To make the centre available for community projects
7. It can sue and be sued in its own name

Objectives

The organisation main objectives are:

1. It is set up of foster development of all kinds including educational and sports development through information and knowledge.
2. In recognition of South Africa's rising population and lack of information and knowledge, our NPO is structured to help community in initiating programs and processes that will bring information and knowledge to benefit children's particularly those at rural areas.
3. Our NPO will also help the less privileged children through various skills acquisition programs.
4. The commitment is towards proper information and knowledge dissemination as well as promotion of development initiatives as a way of responding to needs of the marginalized and insufficiently represented segments of the nation
